TITLE: Development of New Raspberry Cultivars for the Pacific Northwest

FUNDING:

2006-2007 funding from Oregon Raspberry and Blackberry Commission \$1,500. Funds were used for timeslip labor, supplies and services. Other sources of funds for raspberry work at Puyallup include State of Washington, the Washington Red Raspberry Commission and the Northwest Center for Small Fruit Research.

SUMMARY:

Selections were identified at WSU Puyallup that are root rot tolerant and productive. These will be evaluated further and also used as parents. Selections have been identified in machine harvesting trials that appear to harvest well. Some of these selections were run through an IQF tunnel and four WSU selections appear to IQF well. These selections will be transferred to commercial propagators and plants of WSU 1499 and WSU 1502 could be available for grower trials under testing agreements for the 2009 planting season and plants of WSU 1447 and WSU 1557 available for the 2011 planting season.
